From humble beginnings in 1881, St Joseph's College marked its 140th anniversary in 2021. On this foundation, Meliora 140+, the College's new strategic plan, articulates the College direction over the next five years as it moves forward into its ffteenth decade. It honours the Marist Brothers and lay teachers who, since 1881, have strived to educate boys to form young men — in the words of St Marcellin Champagnat — to be good Christians and virtuous citizens.

Meliora 140+ builds on the aims of the previous Strategic Plan 2013+, reinforcing its explicit intention to shape a Catholic culture in which all are valued and respected. Furthermore, it draws on the wisdom of past and present families, Old Boys, students and staf in an ever changing world to ensure that St Joseph's College remains at the forefront of educating young men in the Marist way.

Among its key strategic pursuits, Meliora 140+ commits signif cant resources to forming resilient, hardworking young men of faith, generosity and moral character; it embraces investment in educational research and pedagogy and envisages new and repurposed facilities.

With the spiritual guidance and governance of Marist Schools Australia, and with an optimism reminiscent of that of the pioneering Marist Brothers who stood on this site and dreamed of creating an outstanding educational institution, the College community of today endeavours to keep St Joseph's College among the world's leading Catholic schools.

With respect to our rich and long standing traditions, a self-ef acing evaluation of present-day life at the College and an innovative and sustainable plan for the future, St Joseph's College strives for better things.


In Meliora Contende.



- Providing a range of faith opportunities and Catholic practices for staf, students and families






